<u>2025-2026 PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN</u> Horizons Bible Study Finding Resilience, Joy and Our Identity in Christ

The Rev. Dr. Rhashell D. Hunter, author of Finding Resilience, Joy and Our Identity in Jesus Christ, says turbulent, chaotic, and changing are words we might use to describe our culture today. She asks, "Where do we find resilience, joy and identity in tempestuous times?" Her Bible study will take us through Biblical stories and texts to map out the signposts where we can see resilience, joy and identity. Hunter believes that even in times of crisis, trauma and economic troubles, we can experience our lives centered in Christ, our true North, in finding our way.

Bible study is the common bond for Presbyterian Women. Our circle fellowship has two opportunities available to participate in our new study. Evening participants may join the Zoom study at 7:00 pm on the second Tuesday each month. Those who prefer to meet in the daytime may join us at noon on the second Wednesday. Both studies provide a time for fellowship prior to the study. All are welcome to join either study. Reading the lesson ahead of time is optional.

The study book may be ordered through the church to minimize shipping costs. The study cost has increased to \$14 this year, and the large print edition is now \$20. How can we be less wasteful in our consumption of this planet's finite resources? One good idea that Steve and I picked up from an online course we took in 2022 is for people to rethink a consumer economy so that its design becomes **circular** (reuse, repair, refurbish, repurpose, recycle...) rather than **linear** (take-make-waste). Two examples of circularity we heard about in the course:

- 1. Laws in some European countries require companies (producers) to be responsible for reclaiming the packaging in which they sell their goods. This gets companies paying better attention to the ability to reuse their packaging and cuts down considerably on packaging being relegated to landfill sites.
- 2. Major home items like furniture and carpet can be made available to consumers under a rental-service agreement. For example, your carpet comes in attractive squares; when more heavily used squares show wear the company replaces them and reclaims the worn squares for reprocessing.


PENTECOST SPECIAL OFFERINGS CHILDREN AT RISK • YOUTH • YOUNG ADULTS

One mother walked with her children across six countries through dangerous jungles and across raging rivers to flee violent cartels who threatened her family. Her disabled teenage son was traumatized by their experience but La Escuelita is helping by bringing kids together in a loving setting.
